Alanouwaly Guinea collaborated with Alexander Sigmund Wassertechnik from Germany and his Eau Pure project to install a solar pump and panels to restore a failed well. Over 6 weeks tradesmen and volunteers assessed and prepared the well, built a frame for the solar panels and the 3000l tank with 8 taps and installed the high quality Lorentz pump.

On the 16. June they held a big opening with the regional authorities including governor Siba Loholamu, prefect Mohamed Doumbouya and president of Boke development Oscar Koumbassa. Local and national radio and the national television were there to record it.

We are particular pleased that this source of badly needed clean water was created during Ramadan. It is servicing an area with 200 families, although more people collect water there as it the best source of water around!

Water is Life and there is no bigger gift than clean water!








 Teachers of Plumbing and Electrics of the local vocational school investigated worked on the installation of the solar pump and panels and used it to teach 55 students.

 local craftsmen including plumber, welder, carpenter, electrician worked on the project, each with 2-3 apprentices. A skilled well digger dug the 2 m hole for the electric grounding. The ground is rocky & difficult



- panels and pump were connected by IDEFE, a Conakry firm.
- 10 Alanouwaly volunteers were on site for 6 weeks and helped with all work. They guarded the site day and night after installation and evened out the terrain.
- Equipment and materials were transported by Alanouwaly.
- All activities were directed and overseen by Seny Coumbassa, Alanouwaly's director and Alhassane Coumbassa it's secretary.

Local and national radio as well as national television recorded the event. A committee has been formed with 2 female & 1 male security guards employed to look after the well with a charge of 1 pence per canister to pay for maintenance.

The population of Donghol is hugely benefitting, in particular the women and children, who are tasked with the arduous water fetching. It will improve people's health and free up time for other economic activities and girls can go to school more consistently.
